The Tower of Babel




Genesis 11: 1-9; 12:1-4

Now the whole world had one language and a common speech. As people moved eastward, they found a plain in Shinar (Babylonia) and settled there. They said to each other,

'Come, let's make bricks
and bake them thoroughly.'
They used brick instead of stone,
and bitumen for mortar.
Then they said,


'Come, let us build ourselves a city,
with a tower that reaches to the heavens,
so that we may make a name for ourselves;
otherwise we will be scattered
over the face of the whole earth.'

Come, let us go down and confuse their language so they will not understand each other.'






- Before that time, people built with stones. But the "Babylonians" had a technology breakthrough. What was this new technology that allowed them to build tall buildings?



Question: Why did God confuse the human language? Answer: God did this to save us from hurting ourselves.

- ☐ You see, humans are really good at turning gifts into curses
- And we are wicked indeed ... "The Lord saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intention of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually." (Gen 6:5)
- God did not want humans to combine all our wickedness to do things to hurt ourselves. So He confused our language.

Genesis 12:1-4


The LORD had said to Abram, 'Go from your country, your people and your father's household to the land I will show you.

So Abram went, as the LORD had told him.




Abraham was living in the city of Ur when God called him. He traveled to Shechem, and built an altar there.


People are Still Building the "Tower of Babel" Today!

What's Really Wrong with Human Efforts?

- God loves humans and wants to be reunited with us.
- □ However, something must first be dealt with that is called "sin". Sin separates humans from God.
- ☐ The Babylonians tried to force their way to God without dealing with sin. Modern humans are doing the same.
- ☐ God chose Abraham, and through his descendant Jesus, dealt with sin. By Jesus' death, God forgives our sin and unites us with Him.
- □ Jesus said, "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through me." (John 14:6)
